COLONEL ANDREW J. STEWART

Colonel Andrew J. Stewart serves as the Deputy Commander of the Civil Air Patrol - U.S. Air Force (CAP-USAF) at Maxwell AFB, AL. Originally from New Jersey, he enlisted in the Air Force in April 1998, and completed Basic Military Training at Lackland AFB, TX. He then attended B-52H Maintenance Apprentice Technical School at Sheppard AFB, TX, before being assigned to his first duty station at Barksdale AFB, LA. While serving as a Crew Chief at Barksdale, he was awarded an Air Force commissioning scholarship through the Airmen Scholarship and Commissioning Program, which enabled him to attend Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach while he pursued his commission through AFROTC Detachment 157. Upon graduation, he was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant went on to complete Joint Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training at Vance AFB, OK. In total, Colonel Stewart has flown 3,475 hours with 708 combat hours in the C-17A and the KC-135R/T in support of Operations ENDURING and IRAQI FREEDOM as well as other Global Contingency, Presidential, and Humanitarian/Disaster Relief Airlift and Air Refueling Operations. Throughout his career, Colonel Stewart has held several notable positions, including Deputy Commander of the 97th Mission Support Group



and Deputy Commadner 97th Operations Group, Inspector General of the 97th Air Mobility Wing, 6th Airlift Squadron Operations Officer, and Air Refueling Branch Chief at the 618 Air Operations Center. He also served as the HAF/A1 Rated Force Policy Branch Chief at the Pentagon, where he was responsible for drafting Air Force-level policy and overseeing pay and retention incentives for over 20,000 rated officers. Additionally, Colonel Stewart's commands include the the 305th Maintenance Squadron at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, NJ, and the 97th Force Support Squadron at Altus AFB, OK. As Deputy Commander of CAP-USAF, Colonel Stewart is charged to develop strategic and operational plans in concert with CAP to ensure SECAF employment of CAP services supporting America's communities with emergency response, diverse aviation and ground services, youth development, and promotion of air, space and cyber power through aerospace education for 69,000 volunteers.
